ACT Film and Television Council Seminar Series

The art of making money and time fit together!

In every area of film, video and audio production the expenditure of money is intimately linked to the expenditure of time. How long artists, technicians, facilities and equipment need to be engaged directly influences cost. Despite this fact money is understood to be a finite commodity, but time is frequently treated as being somehow flexible. Estimates are made of how long something will take - even, how long a scene will run - that are little better than guesses. The result is almost always to under-estimate time, and because a blow-out in time means a blow-out in cost the effect is invariably compromise, and occasionally disaster. In this seminar, seasoned industry professionals will talk about the importance of accurately budgeting time, give some practical "how to" tips, and alert you to the importance of time budgeting with some hair-raising stories.
